Born in Ewing, Nebraska, Robert Hanna holds a degree in architecture from the University of Nebraska and has maintained an architectural practice in Lincoln since 1968. He has won many awards throughout his professional career, and his talents for drawing have made him a prolific and sought-after artist who captures a unique look at Nebraska's history. His art represents his fascination with the human proclivity for building and the expansive Nebraska landscape. In his words: "Set down a towering county courthouse in the middle of a wide Nebraska horizon, and even the government looks mighty small."
